**Language Arts:** Students will continue to review and practise the phonograms and spelling rules associated with their weekly spelling lists, identify the subject, predicate verb, helping verb, and adverbs in sentences, and explore trickster tales from around the world, comparing and contrasting characteristics of the trickster figure in folk literature. Students will study the following:

#### Grammar

- Identify parts of speech—nouns, verbs, adverbs, adjectives
- Identify subject-verb agreement
- Identify prefixes and suffixes

#### Writing (in telling fables)

- Practise literary device—anthromorphism (animals act like human beings)
- Practise critical and chronological thinking
- Analyze characters
- Use synonyms: nouns and adjectives
- Practise amplification and summary
- Practise proper elocution (the art of speaking skillfully)

#### Literature

- *Anansi Tales, Brer Rabbit Gets Fox’s Dinner, Brer Rabbit Goes Back to Mr. Man’s Garden, The Lion and the Mouse, Hunter’s Song, Lone Dog, What’s My Name?, Three Young Bulls and a Lion*

**Christian Education:** Students will continue to explore Genesis 4 -11 in Unit 4 of our Bible curriculum titled *The Fall to Babel: Need for a Savior*. Topics will include the following:

- Cain and Abel
- Adam to Noah
- The Flood and Promise
- Tower of Babel

**History/Geography:** Students have launched into the study of Africa in preparation for the Walk Through History Day. Following this study, students will return to medieval Japan. Topics include:

- The African kingdoms
- Gold, salt, and Ghana
- Mansa Musa of Mali
- The Songhay empire
- The Samurai warriors
- Maps of the time period

**Mathematics:** Students will continue to learn and review the multiplication tables of 6, 7, 8, & 9, divide to find the number of items in each group, understand related multiplication and division facts, and write division sentences for real-world problems before moving on to mental multiplication. Students will:

- Express the multiplication fact on a number line
- Use an array model to show multiplication facts
- Use area models to show multiplication facts
- Use multiplication facts already known to find other multiplication facts
- Multiply by 1, 10 & 100

## Grade 3 – The Grammar Stage

Innova Academy's grammar school curriculum builds a solid academic foundation, emphasizing mastery of facts and fundamental skills. Grammar stage students have the natural ability to retain large amounts of information, so Innova intentionally builds knowledge across the curriculum immersing students in a holistic, unified, and rich learning experience. Students are actively engaged in learning while applying skills they have previously acquired to new, expansive content. Classrooms are filled with singing, chanting, movement, and engaging hands-on activities. Strong habits of heart, mind, and soul are reinforced, as students become more aware of their impact on others and build skills in self-governance and responsibility.

**Science:** Students will continue to investigate forces and electricity. Topics include:

- The three Laws of Motion
- Balanced and unbalanced forces
- Spotlight on Isaac Newton
- Magnetism
- Electrical charges
- Spotlight on Benjamin Franklin

**Latin 2:** Students will continue to learn new vocabulary, translate simple sentences, learn singular and plural verbs and review Chapters 8-12 in preparation for a Unit 2 assessment. Topics include:

- Things to learn in school
- Celebrations
- Review – Chapter 13

**French 1:** This month, students will continue with the AIM (Accelerative Integrated Methodology) as well as prepare for the Christmas concert. Students will:

- Continue rehearsing, memorizing, and acting out the play *Les trois petits cochons* (The Three Little Pigs)
- Learn how to structure simple French sentences with familiar vocabulary
- Continue to practise the play and gestures at home using the online portal or DVD
- Continue to rehearse the song that we will perform for the Christmas concert

**Visual Arts:** Following a focus on African art and preparation for the Walk Through History Day, students will continue an extensive focus on the element of colour, creating a number of projects including:

- A primary colour quilt design
- A primary three-colour paint project
- A colour-mixing worksheet
- An exploration of warm and cool colours in selected picture book illustrations

**Dramatic Arts:** This month, students will continue to develop dramatic skills. They will:

- Pantomime mood and feelings
- Experiment with characterization and improvisation.

**Music:** Students will continue to develop musical skills as they prepare for the Innova Christmas concert. Students will:

- Develop their skills performing as part of an ensemble
- Learn to follow a conductor
- Grow in their ability to focus and give attention to detail

**Physical Education:** Students will complete the unit on volleyball begun last month and will then begin basketball. Students will learn:

- Skills (dribbling, passing, shooting)
- Rules of the game
- How to play offence and defence

*Please note that although students in different grades often study the same topic, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.*
