We would like to extend a warm welcome to both new and returning families! Innova is truly blessed and awed by God's grace and goodness as we enter our third year. Thank you for the opportunity to partner with your family in educating your child for the glory of God.

In **Language Arts**, students will learn how to speak in front of a group, demonstrate polite behaviour, introduce themselves, greet others politely by saying their first and last name clearly, and learn short common verbal phrases. Students will also begin to recognize their own names in printed form.

JK students will be introduced to explicit **Phonics** beginning with the letter sounds /b/, /m/, /p/, /s/, /t/, /d/, /ē/, /ē/, /ă/, and /ā/. They will also learn to print the upper case letters *B, M, P, S, T, D, E,* and *A*.

**Vocabulary** study will focus on words that describe being a good helper and words for members of a family.

In **Literature** students will read the following books: *Each Peach Pear Plum* by Allan Ahlberg and *The Runaway Bunny* by Margaret Wise Brown. As stories are read aloud, students will listen for the phonemes /b/, /m/, /p/, /s/, /t/, /d/, /ē/, /ē/, /ă/, and /ā/.

In **Mathematics** this month, students will recognize, sequence and count numbers 0 to 5 and write numbers 1 and 2. Next, students will learn to sort and classify common objects. At the end of the month, students will identify and reproduce simple patterns.

In **Bible**, students will focus on how God created everything. After Adam and Eve's sin, God provided a plan of redemption for mankind through the promise of a Saviour. Students will hear about how God protected Noah through the flood and preserved His plan of redemption through him. Next, students will learn about God's plan to overcome sin and how it was accomplished through the making of a great nation through Abraham and his descendants. Our Bible memory verses this month are Genesis 1:1 and Genesis 28:15.

In **Science**, students will begin the year discovering what a scientist is and does. We will discuss, explore, and experiment with the five senses God gave us so that we may experience all that He has created. Students will understand that God has made us curious with the need and capacity to learn. Through nature walks, songs, and hands-on activities, students will begin their journey exploring God's world and becoming mini-scientists.

This year, JK students will create their very own **Art** portfolios to display and share their artwork with classmates. They will begin the year learning primary and secondary colours through examining different pieces of classical art. Students will also become familiar with the differences between warm and cool colours and how they can use colour to display emotion. Students will be exposed to Van Gough's famous painting of *Starry Night* and



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## JK – The Grammar Stage

The grammar stage builds a solid academic foundation. Children have a natural ability to readily absorb large quantities of information. They find memorization enjoyable, and happily sing and chant phonics and grammar rules, math facts, Latin vocabulary, the names of the continents and oceans, and the important events and dates of history. Grammar school education focuses on the absorption of facts and rules, and lays the foundation for the logic stage.

create their own landscapes using warm and cool colours.

In **History/Geography**, students will learn about the earth, beginning with the seven continents and their corresponding names. They will recognize the globe as a model of the earth, learn the four cardinal directions, north, south, east and west, and locate the North and South Poles on a map. At the end of the month, students will learn the country and continent where they live and locate it on a globe and/or map.

This month, JK students will be introduced to **Latin** through songs, learning the Latin words for “Hello”, “Goodbye”, “Teacher”, “Student”, “Tell me what your name is” and “My name is...”

In **Physical Education** students will focus on having fun while learning skill-building activities such as throwing, catching, rolling, and bouncing balls.

JK students will have many opportunities for **Dramatic** play. This month students will learn about the role of characters in a play. Students will explore different types of characters and examine the role of emotion in displaying character. Students will then be able to create their own character for a play and present their character to the class using emotion.

**Music** class is a space where children learn to express themselves through the art of music and have the chance to explore the many ways in which music can be engaged. I am so excited to begin this journey with the JK/SK class! In September, students will begin to learn the basics of music such as pulse, high/low, up/down, same/different, and fast/slow. They will explore vocal qualities and identify the timbres of unpitched percussion instruments. Students will also have the chance to learn proper mallet technique and experiment with Orff instruments.

*Innova Academy has modified some of our curricular sequencing to facilitate split grade classes. This allows for enhanced classroom discussion and student interaction. Please note that although students in different grades study the same topic in some subject areas, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.*
