Junior and Senior Kindergarten **Language Arts:** Students will continue to develop phonetic awareness, expand their vocabulary, and study two literature units titled "Dig Deep", and "Peter Rabbit". This month, students will focus on the following:

Phonics:

• Learn the letter sounds short a, i, o, u, qu, z, w, and x

Literature:

• Listen to and discuss stories including Rapunzel, The Grand Canyon, Mike Mulligan and His Shovel, Tale of Peter Rabbit, and Tale of Benjamin Rabbit.

Writing:

- Practise letter formation
- Print words from different word families focusing on the *endings ot, ox, ug, ut, ad, ag, am, an, ap at, ed, en, et,* and *ig.*
- Create short sentences from different words families

Vocabulary

- Learn the meaning of words related to family and friends
- Learn the meaning of words related to colours and shapes

Christian Education: Students will continue to learn how God's people listened to and responded to Him. Topics include:

- Elijah and the fiery chariot
- Elisha and the Shunamite family
- The healing of Naaman
- King Josiah
- Jonah and the fish
- Nineveh
- Daniel and his friends
- Esther becomes queen and saves her people
- Memory Verse: "God has said, 'Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you.' So, we say with confidence, 'The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid" (Hebrews 13:5-6).

History / Geography: Students will continue their travels around the world learning about all the continents while highlighting certain cities, animals and traditions. This month, topics include:

- Ireland
- Netherlands
- Russia

Mathematics: In Mathematics, students will continue to review their numbers to 20 and learn about solid and flat shapes. Topics include:

- Rote counting to 20
- Reading and writing numeral to 20
- Comparing groups up to 20 objects
- Ordering groups up to 20 objects
- Identifying the face, edge, and corner of shapes

SK – The Grammar Stage

Innova Academy's grammar school curriculum builds a solid academic foundation. emphasizing mastery of facts and fundamental skills. Grammar stage students have the natural ability to retain large amounts of information, so Innova intentionally builds knowledge across the curriculum immersing students in a holistic, unified, and rich learning experience. Students are actively engaged in learning while applying skills they have previously acquired to new, expansive content. Classrooms are filled with singing, chanting, movement, and engaging hands-on activities. Science: Kindergarten students will enjoy getting messy and conducting a variety of Christmas science experiments during the month of December. The five senses and different states of matter will be explored with the following lessons:

Latin: Students will continue to learn and master Latin vocabulary put to song and chants to help with pronunciation and memorization. This month, we will focus on the following words and phrases:

- How are you?
- I am good or bad or happy
- Hello
- Goodbye
- Teacher
- Student

Visual Arts: In December, students will explore the next element of art - texture. Topics include:

- Brueghel texture collage using natural material
- Sculpting in art history
- Sculpture using texture
- Creating Christmas ornaments using texture

Dramatic Arts: In December, students will work on creating the Christmas story drama. Students will:

• Use pantomime and body expression to tell the story of Jesus' birth.

Music: Students will continue to develop musical skills as they prepare for our Christmas concert. Students will:

- Learn to match pitches and keep a steady beat
- Develop their ability to sing in a group
- Learn to follow a conductor

Physical Education: Students will be introduced to kicking and control skills using balls and beanbags. The following skills will be covered:

- Dribbling
- Ball kicking variations
- Kicking to a target

Please note that although students in different grades often study the same topic, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.
