Language Arts: Students will continue to develop necessary skills for building and creating sentences on their journey to becoming outstanding writers. Language arts topics include:

Literature

- *Robin Hood* by Annie Ingle
- *The Warrior and the Baby*
- *The Hippopotamus and the Tortoise*
- *The Dog and His Shadow*

Writing

- Writing poetry
- Verb tense
- Using quotations
- Possessive nouns

Vocabulary

- Prefixes and suffixes
- Identify real-life connections between words and their uses
- Identify roots to aid in determining word meaning

Christian Education: In May, students will continue their study of the nation of Israel throughout the Old Testament. Students will be introduced to the first king of Israel and examine the lives of the kings of Israel and the stories that surround their lives. This month students will focus on:

- King Saul
- David at Saul's court
- Saul's final battle
- Jerusalem and the Ark
- David and Absalom
- Solomon's anointing
- Solomon's choice

History / Geography: Students in Grade 2 are always excited to travel back through history and learn about what life was like in another time and place! In May, students will begin to explore the topic of Community. Students will study:

- The history of the town of Newmarket
- The geography of the land surrounding Newmarket
- The role of students as it pertains to community

Mathematics: During the month of May, Grade 2 students will review and expand their knowledge of multiplication and division. Specific lessons will include:

- Multiplying by 3, skip counting, and using dot paper
- Multiplying by 4, skip counting, and using dot paper
- Divide by using related multiplication facts
- Solving real-world problems
- Bar-models

Grade 2 – The Grammar Stage

Innova Academy's grammar school curriculum builds a solid academic foundation, emphasizing mastery of facts and fundamental skills. Grammar stage students have the natural ability to retain large amounts of information, so Innova intentionally builds knowledge across the curriculum immersing students in a holistic, unified, and rich learning experience. Students are actively engaged in learning while applying skills they have previously acquired to new, expansive content. Classrooms are filled with singing, chanting, movement, and engaging hands-on activities. Strong habits of heart, mind, and soul are reinforced, as students become more aware of their impact on others and build skills in self-governance and responsibility.

Science: May is an exciting time in Grade 2 science class because we have the privilege of enjoying God's creation in our classroom! Students are anxiously awaiting the hatching of 12 eggs in our classroom. This month students will study:

- The life cycle of a chicken
- The development of a chick inside an egg
- The nutritional value of an egg
- How to take care of live chicks

Latin 1: Grade 2 students love to practise Latin vocabulary. Please encourage your child to teach your family what they are learning this month! Students will also be given time to review the words they have learned this year. Topics will include words that pertain to:

- Water
- Gardening

Visual Arts: This month, students will complete a unit on Monet and will begin exploring Van Gogh's landscape masterpieces. Topics include:

- Creating a Monet masterpiece: The Water Lily Pond
- Who is Vincent Van Gogh?
- Techniques in Van Gogh's paintings
- Van Gogh landscape collage

Dramatic Arts: This month in drama, students will complete a unit on Aesop's fables and begin a story telling unit. Topics include:

- The Turtle and Hare skit presentation
- Introduction to storytelling
- Elements of storytelling

Music: The Innova students are very busy preparing for the spring concert on May 25th. Students are:

- Playing Orff instruments in an ensemble
- Learning to read rhythmic notation
- Developing their ability to sing on pitch with a good tone
- Developing rhythmic awareness

Physical Education: In gym class, students will learn a new sport! They will learn many new skills and then apply them in a game of lacrosse. Students will explore how to:

- Run with a lacrosse stick
- Pass with a lacrosse stick
- Score in a lacrosse game

Please note that although students in different grades often study the same topic, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.
