

The Month Ahead

Grade 8



Language Arts: This month, students will read, discuss, analyze, think, and write critically in response to Mark Twain's The Adventures of Tom Sawyer. Students will also continue working in their Writing & Rhetoric book as they are guided through the steps of writing their first multi-paragraph research papers. Specific lessons will include:

Literature - The Adventures of Tom Sawyer

- Vocabulary
- Characterization
- Similes & metaphors
- Descriptive writing
- Comprehension questions & analysis of text
- Digging deeper Making the text more personal by applying God's Word

Writing & Rhetoric

- Note taking
- Paraphrasing to avoid plagiarism
- When and how to cite sources
- Differentiating between reliable and unreliable sources
- Practise creating in-text citations and building a Works Cited list

Christian Education: During the month of April, students will read and explore the gospel of John during morning devotions. In class, students will thoughtfully read and discuss a chapter from Bruce Ware's book Big Truths for Young Hearts titled "Who is Jesus?" Titles include:

- A Person Who Was Alive Long Before He Was Born
- The Incarnation God and Man Together
- Jesus Lived in the Power of the Spirit
- Jesus Resisted Temptation, Living a Sinless Life
- What Christians of the Early Church Came to Believe about Christ

History/Geography: Students will continue to broaden their knowledge of how both America and Canada became the great nations they are today. Our focus from now until the end of the year will be the 19th century. Lessons during the month of April will include:

Canadian History - British North America (BNA) in the Mid-1800s

- Who were the people of BNA?
- What was life like in BNA?
- Physical, political, and economic features of BNA
- Factors that drew the BNA colonies together

American History - The War Between the States: Part 1

- Abraham Lincoln and secession
- The Rebels and the Yanks
- Battles of 1861: Fort Sumter and Bull Run
- Battles of 1862: The Ironclads and Shiloh

Logic: Students will continue to explore logical fallacies. This month's lessons will include:

- What is a generalization?
- Hasty generalizations
- What is an analogy?
- Hasty analogies

Mathematics: Students will learn how to calculate the volume and surface area of the following three-dimensional shapes:

- Cylinders
- Cones

Grade 8 – The Logic Stage

The strong knowledge base established in the grammar school provides a solid foundation as students enter the logic school. As perspective widens, students start to make meaningful connections across the curriculum. Students show more independence in their learning and establish systems in self-regulation and personal study skills. Shaping students' habits of heart, mind, and soul is a key focus as students deepen their understanding of God's purpose for his creation and their role in his redemptive plan. Teachers continue to foster the love of learning, and students have opportunities to show marked maturity academically and spiritually as they learn to critically analyze ideas and speak to issues in light of God's purposes.

Science: This month, students are preparing for the science fair held on April 13th. They will also study the human body focusing on the following areas:

- Muscle types
- Skin structure and function

Latin 4: In April, students will complete and write a quiz on Chapter 21 (the verb "to be" in the past tense) in Latin for Children, Primer A. Students will then work on Chapter 22 (prepositions and prepositional phrases). Students will:

- Continue to review noun declension, verb conjugation, parsing, and vocabulary from previous chapters
- Learn and work with all new vocabulary from Chapters 21 and 22
- Explore the different noun cases/jobs in Latin
- Learn the definition and purpose of prepositional phrases and how they are expressed in Latin
- Examine authentic Latin texts including song lyrics and Scripture

French 3: In April, the Level 3 French class will continue with the AIM (Accelerative Integrated Methodology), with students practising the play and gestures at home using the online portal or DVD. Students will:

- Continue rehearsing, memorizing, and acting out the play Un jour bizarre
- Work with a new list of vocabulary words in preparation for a spelling test
- Continue to practise answering open-ended questions in French
- Practise conjugating verbs with the subject pronouns je, tu, il, elle and on

Visual Arts: This month, students will continue to explore the art produced for trade with Africa and Asia in the Renaissance. Topics include:

- The importance of Giorgio Sideri
- The Ming Dynasty and porcelain art
- Turkish porcelain art
- Creating a porcelain plate

Dramatic Arts: This month, students will participate in a miming workshop. Topics Include:

- The history of mime
- Mime techniques
- Mime charades
- Mime presentation

Music: In April, students will continue to expand their knowledge of ukulele, the treble clef staff, and two-part harmony as well as practise repertoire for the spring concert. Specifically, they will cover:

- Ensemble playing on boomwhackers
- Spring choral and ukulele repertoire
- Chording on the ukulele
- Listening exercises

Physical Education: Students will begin to learn the game of badminton this month, and will focus on the following:

- Rules of the game
- Serving
- Hitting and receiving
- Strategy

Please note that although students in different grades often study the same topic, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.
