*Grade 5 students have opportunities to show marked maturity academically and spiritually as they learn to make meaningful connections and critically analyze ideas. Teachers continue to foster the love of learning, and lead students to deepen their understanding of God's purpose for His creation and their role in His redemptive plan.*

**Christian Education:** This month, Grade 5 students will begin memorizing the second chapter of Philippians. As we continue to follow Jesus' ministry, students will learn and discuss the significance of His:

- Death
- Burial
- Resurrection

**Literature and Writing:** This month, students will enjoy and explore poetry by famous authors such as Robert Louis Stevenson, John Masefield, J.R.R. Tolkien, and Robert Frost. Students will:

- Interpret poetry and support interpretations with evidence from the text
- Discuss perspective and symbolism
- Distinguish figurative from literal language
- Identify action as conveyed through vivid verbs
- Define rhyming couplet
- Identify rhyme scheme
- Identify imagery, metaphor, simile, onomatopoeia, personification, and alliteration
- Write original poems using the literary techniques studied

**Spelling:** Using the *Spell to Write and Read* program, students develop spelling skills through word analysis and understanding and applying spelling rules to daily writing across the curriculum. This month, students will:

- Analyze and learn weekly spelling words from the class list and student writing
- Review and apply all spelling rules learned to date

**Grammar:** Grammar study develops students' awareness and understanding of how the English language is structured. As students work through the grammar program, they apply their knowledge to writing in all subject areas. This month's grammar study will focus on:

- Prepositional phrases used as adjectives and adverbs
- Diagramming sentences with prepositional phrases
- Transitive active verbs and direct objects
- Diagramming sentences with direct objects

**Latin and Greek Vocabulary:** Through the study of Latin and Greek prefixes, suffixes, and vocabulary, students enrich their English vocabulary. Students will:

- Learn Greek and Latin vocabulary, prefixes and suffixes: dia, bole, desmos, gnosis, gony, trans, porto, ago, scribo, fero, latum, formo, planta, pareo
- Learn English derivatives and deconstruct English words

**French:** In French this month, students will continue to learn new gestured vocabulary and will be introduced to important grammar concepts. Students will:

- Memorize 1 John 3:1
- Continue rehearsing, memorizing and acting out the play *Salut mon ami!*
- Work towards answering questions in complete sentences

## Grade 5 – The Logic Stage

The strong knowledge base established in the grammar school provides a solid foundation as students enter the logic school. As perspective widens, students start to make meaningful connections across the curriculum. Students show more independence in their learning and establish systems in self-regulation and personal study skills. Shaping students' habits of heart, mind, and soul is a key focus as students deepen their understanding of God's purpose for his creation and their role in his redemptive plan. Teachers continue to foster the love of learning, and students have opportunities to show marked maturity academically and spiritually as they learn to critically analyze ideas and speak to issues in light of God's purposes.

- Continue to practice gestures and vocabulary at home using the online portal and vocabulary cards
- Work towards speaking exclusively in French with fewer teacher prompts

**History/Geography:** This year, history study focuses on Canadian history from 1400 to 1800. This month, students will focus on:

- Geography: the states of the eastern United States
- Map reading using latitude and longitude, coordinates, and degrees
- The fur trade
- The story of Radisson and Groseillier

**Mathematics:** This month, Grade 5 students will begin multiplying and dividing fractions. Topics include:

- Multiplying proper and improper fractions
- Multiplying mixed numbers
- Dividing fractions by a whole number
- Solving real world problems by multiplying and dividing fractions

**Science:** Grade 5 students will complete their study of matter. Specific topics include:

- Atoms and their composition
- States of matter
- Describing matter
- The periodic table of elements

**Visual Arts:** Students will complete their illustrations of the legends they have written and continue their examination of Canadian art history. Students will learn about printmaking techniques and investigate the use of those techniques in Canadian art. Visual arts topics and projects for this month include:

- Completing their landscape drawings to illustrate their legends
- Canadian printmaking
- Inuit prints of Cape Dorset

**Music:** Innova students are very busy preparing for their Christmas concerts. Over the next few weeks, music classes will mostly consist of rehearsals for these concerts. However, lessons will also include:

- Review of terms
- Subdividing rhythms
- Classical period listening and composer review

**Physical Education:** This month, students will learn about and play basketball. They will focus on improving their overall performance in the following areas:

- Rules
- Dribbling
- Passing
- Shooting
- Stance

*Please note that although students in different grades often study the same topic, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.*
