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Our Junior Kindergarten program is designed to introduce children to the joy of learning through themebased units. Students will listen to wonderful selections of classic children's literature and respond through engaging hands-on activities. We are committed to developing the whole child by providing a pleasant environment for children to take chances and explore. Above all, we strive to lead children to taste the joys of being a child of God and grow in their understanding of serving Him.

JK – The Grammar Stage

Innova Academy's grammar school curriculum builds a solid academic foundation, emphasizing mastery of facts and fundamental skills. Mathematics: Students will learn to recognize and say their numbers through songs and chants and use various tactile means to practice proper number formation. This month, they will cover the following:

- Count, read and write numbers 10 20
- Solid shapes
- Flat shapes in solid shapes
- Drawing flat shapes
- Flat shape pictures
- Shape patterns

Science: Students will begin learning about God's creation though our themed animal units on bears and lions. This month, students will explore:

- The characteristics of bears
- Hibernation
- Honey tasting
- · Where lions live
- Carnivores
- The lion's mane

Visual Arts: Students will learn about the art of weaving. Using various tactile means, students will explore:

- Button weaving
- Circle weaving
- Lion lines
- Easter line art

Music: In March, students will continue to refine their mallet technique and continue to practice rhythms on the Orff instruments. They will also begin a unit on orchestra instruments and what they sound like. More specifically, they will work on:

- Rhythmic notation
- Percussion instruments of the orchestra
- Listening: William Tell Overture
- Solfege Scale
- Spring concert repertoire

Physical Education: Students will continue to learn skill-building activities and travelling skills while developing good sportsmanship and having fun. This month's skills include:
