Grade 3 students are actively engaged in building foundational knowledge and skills in all subject areas. Our classroom is filled with reading, discussion, chants, and engaging hands-on activities. We seek to provide a safe and nurturing classroom environment where students can deepen their awareness of God's love and relationship with him, as well as meet their potential for academic success.

Christian Education: This month, students will continue their study of *Faerie Gold: Treasures from the Land of Enchantment*. Students will:

- Study the wonder of fairy tales through personal reflection and class discussion
- Become familiar with virtues worthy of imitation
- Memorize the books of the Bible and study the types of literature found in the Bible
- Begin reading about the exodus of the Israelites from Egypt

Literature: Students will begin their study of Greek and Roman Myths through our K-12 *Classics for Young Readers* anthology to build upon their growing knowledge of Greek and Roman history. Literature class is conducted through the following activities:

- Vocabulary work
- Comprehension work
- Narration
- Discussion

Writing: Students will expand their writing ability by imitating masterful compositions through our IEW program. This month, students will work on:

- Retelling a narrative work through multiple paragraphs
- Taking notes on a masterful narrative work
- Adding quality adjectives and strong verbs to their work

Spelling: Each month, students will practice memorizing phonograms as well as learn fifteen new words each week. Students will:

- Develop greater awareness of how the English language is structured
- Apply their skills to writing across the curriculum
- Learn unique spelling rules

Grammar: Students will learn the rules of English grammar and apply them in their writing. This month, students will practice:

- Singular and plural nouns
- Irregular nouns
- Possessive nouns

Latin: Students will practice new vocabulary through gestures and classroom activities. Vocabulary words will center around the following topics:

- Helping at home
- Communication with others
- Travel
- School

Grade 3 – The Grammar Stage

Innova Academy's grammar school curriculum builds a solid academic foundation, emphasizing mastery of facts and fundamental skills. Grammar stage students have the natural ability to retain large amounts of information, so Innova intentionally builds knowledge across the curriculum immersing students in a holistic, unified, and rich learning experience. Students are actively engaged in learning while applying skills they have previously acquired to new, expansive content. Classrooms are filled with singing, chanting, movement, and engaging hands-on activities. Strong habits of heart, mind, and soul are reinforced, as students become more aware of their impact on others and build skills in self-governance and responsibility.

French: Students will begin memorizing the play *Le chat et la lune*. Students will:

- Begin answering questions about the play in French
- Become familiar with gestured vocabulary and practice speaking independently
- Listen to short stories and expand their French vocabulary

History: This month, students will learn about the city-states of Sparta and Athens. Topics include:

- Life in Athens
- Life in Sparta
- Greece's war with Persia

Mathematics: In math, students will apply their understanding of addition and subtraction to solve word problems. Topics include:

- Subtraction across zeroes
- Real world problems with addition and subtraction
- Multiplication properties

Science: During science class, students will learn about the microscopic world. Students will:

- Compare different types of cells
- Learn about the work of Robert van Leeuwenhoek and Robert Hooke
- Examine cells from different parts of the plant

Visual Arts: This month, students will design Remembrance Day posters and begin a drawing unit. Areas of study include:

- Poster design: the theme of Remembrance Day
- The message through images - Canadian symbols and words
- Drawing basics focusing on the following elements of design: line, shape, space, colour, value, and texture.

Music: In music, the grade three class will review music notation rhythmically, with solfege and with note names. They will learn musical terms, instruments, and listen to famous classical music. They will also begin preparing for the Christmas concert in December. Lessons include:

- Treble clef staff: directional reading with solfege or note names
- 2/4, 3/4, 4/4 meters
- Legato and staccato
- Christmas repertoire
- Orchestra: Woodwinds and percussion

Physical Education: This month, students will continue to work on their running endurance. Students will:

- Practice running long distances
- Learn about the game of basketball
- Practice dribbling and passing a basketball

Please note that although students in different grades often study the same topic, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.
