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Senior Kindergarten is a time of magical growth where children learn foundational knowledge and skills to develop a life-long love of learning. Students will listen to wonderful selections of classic children's literature and respond through engaging hands-on activities. We are committed to developing the whole child by providing a pleasant environment for children to take chances and explore. Above all, we strive to lead children to taste the joys of being a child of God and grow in their understanding of serving Him.

Christian Education: This month, students will study Joshua and the time of the judges. Students will:

- Explore how God continues to keep His promises to the Israelites
- Discover how God chose and equipped people such as Joshua, Gideon, and Samson
- Discuss how God is patient with disobedient people

Language Arts: Students will explore stories, poems, songs, chants, and hands-on activities each month. Literature selections this month include *The Mitten*, "Migrating Monarchs: A Butterfly Vacation," *A Story, A Story*, "Spider and Turtle and Good Manners," and *The Wombat and the Kangaroo*. During daily read-aloud time, students will enjoy listening to a variety of classroom stories. Using various tactile means as well as songs and chants, students will:

- Review and practice letters and their sounds
- Develop penmanship skills using proper grip and letter formation
- Discuss the story elements of character and setting
- Make predictions before and during reading
- Continue to review vowel sounds
- Discover the endings -es, s, -ff, -ll, -zz, -ss, and -all
- Practice writing complete sentences with proper punctuation

Culture/Geography: Students will enjoy an exciting journey around the world during geography and culture class! This month, students will learn about the continent of Europe. Students will:

- Visit the Emerald Isle and learn about leprechauns and shamrocks
- Explore Germany and learn about the Grimm brothers' fairy tales

Mathematics: In mathematics, students will continue to explore numbers using various hands-on manipulatives, songs, and chants. This month, students will continue to explore numbers from twenty to one hundred. Students will then focus on comparing and combining different sets of numbers. Specifically, students will:

- Count, order, and compare numbers to 100

SK – The Grammar Stage

Innova Academy's grammar school curriculum builds a solid academic foundation, emphasizing mastery of facts and fundamental skills. Grammar stage students have the natural ability to retain large amounts of information, so Innova intentionally builds knowledge across the curriculum immersing students in a holistic, unified, and rich learning experience. Students are actively engaged in learning while applying skills they have previously acquired to new, expansive content. Classrooms are filled with singing, chanting, movement, and engaging hands-on activities. Strong habits of heart, mind, and soul are reinforced, as students become more aware of their impact on others and build skills in self-governance and responsibility.

Science: In science this month, students will investigate a variety of materials. They will participate in science experiments and hands-on activities to study the following questions:

- What are wood, metal, rubber, and leather like?
- What is clay like?
- What are fabrics and paper like?
- What are glass and plastic like?

Art: This year, Senior Kindergarten students will be introduced to the seven elements of design - colour, line, shape, texture, form, space, and value and learn to incorporate these elements into their artwork. In art class this month, students will explore the element of space. Students will:

- Identify the use of space in a variety of completed art projects
- Create Valentine themed crafts

Music: In music this month, there will be a stronger emphasis on pitch matching, keeping a steady pulse, and understanding rhythmic notation. More specifically, students will explore:

- Half notes and half rests
- Good singing tone and correct pitch matching
- Rhythmic patterns on unpitched percussion instruments
- Jazz

Physical Education: During physical education, students will have opportunities to develop spatial awareness, balance, and coordination using their bodies. Students are encouraged to go outside as much as possible and enjoy God's creation through exercise. This month, students will practice:

- Following various exercise routines
- Completing various activities outside to enjoy fresh air and to develop healthy habits

Please note that although students in different grades often study the same topic, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.
