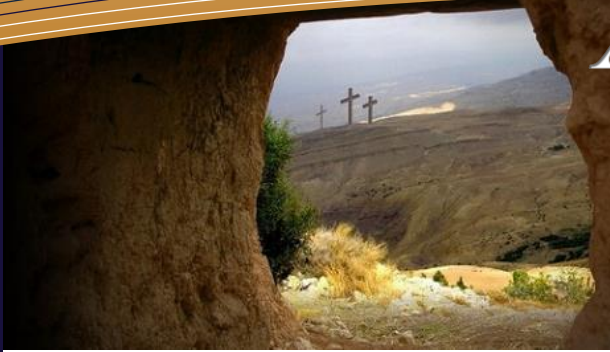

Senior Kindergarten is a time of magical growth where children learn foundational skills to develop a life-long love of learning. Students will listen to wonderful selections of classic children's literature and respond through engaging hands-on activities. We are committed to developing the whole child by providing a pleasant environment for children to take chances and explore. Above all, we strive to lead children to taste the joys of being a child of God and grow in their understanding of serving Him.

Christian Education: Students learn through the examples of biblical characters how God showed his love for His people and how His people showed their love and gratitude in return. Students are challenged to find ways they can show their love for God. This month, students will begin to study Samuel and the Kings: Topics include:

- God's call on Samuel's life
- God provided a king for Israel
- The life of Saul and David

Language Arts: Students will explore stories, poems, songs, chants, and hands-on activities each month. Literature selections this month include *The Foolish Rabbit*, "Being Nosy About Smells," and *The Honest Woodsman*. During daily read-aloud time, students will enjoy listening to a variety of classroom stories. Using various tactile means as well as songs and chants, students will:

- Continue practicing phonograms and decoding more complex words
- Develop penmanship skills using proper grip and letter formation
- Discuss the story elements of character and setting
- Make predictions before and during reading
- Practice writing several related complete sentences with proper punctuation
- Practice writing simple stories

Culture/Geography: Students will enjoy an exciting journey around the world during geography and culture class. This month, students will continue to learn about the continent of Asia. Students will:

- Discover the Japanese tale *The Legend of Momotaro*
- Explore the landforms of India
- Identify India on a map of Asia

Mathematics: In mathematics, students will continue to explore numbers using various hands-on manipulatives, songs, and chants. This month, students will study a chapter titled *Number Facts*. When completed, they will then begin a unit on measurement. Specifically, students will:

- Combine sets of numbers
- Explore how many more are needed for values up to 15

SK – The Grammar Stage

Innova Academy's grammar school curriculum builds a solid academic foundation, emphasizing mastery of facts and fundamental skills. Grammar stage students have the natural ability to retain large amounts of information, so Innova intentionally builds knowledge across the curriculum immersing students in a holistic, unified, and rich learning experience. Students are actively engaged in learning while applying skills they have previously acquired to new, expansive content. Classrooms are filled with singing, chanting, movement, and engaging hands-on activities. Strong habits of heart, mind, and soul are reinforced, as students become more aware of their impact on others and build skills in self-governance and responsibility.

- Compose and decompose numbers to 20
- Compare lengths using terms long, short, longer, shorter, longest, and shortest

Science: In science this month, students will investigate God's non-living world. By participating in science experiments and hands-on activities, students will study the following questions:

- What are non-living things like?
- What are rocks and soil like?

Art: This year, senior kindergarten students are introduced to the seven elements of design (colour, line, shape, texture, form, space, value) and learn to incorporate them into their artwork. This month, students will explore the element of value. Students will:

- Learn to identify value in art projects
- Experiment with mixing colours
- Create spring-themed art projects

Music: As we enter the final months of the school year, the senior kindergarten class will begin preparing repertoire for the spring concert. They will also review all they have learned throughout the year and continue to build on their skills on the Orff instruments. More specific goals include:

- Keeping a steady off-beat pulse on unpitched percussion
- Mallet technique
- Repetitive patterns on the Orff instruments
- Identifying rhythmic notation
- Identifying *so-mi*

Physical Education: During physical education, students will have opportunities to develop spatial awareness, balance, and coordination while developing good sportsmanship skills. Students will spend time outside to enjoy God's creation while exercising. This month, students will practice:

- Completing various activities, games, and exercise routines outside to enjoy fresh air and to develop healthy habits
- Following instructions while participating in team and cooperative games

Please note that although students in different grades often study the same topic, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.
