Grade 3 and

Grade 3 students are actively engaged in building foundational knowledge and skills in all subject areas. Our classroom is filled with reading, discussion, singing, and engaging hands-on activities. We seek to provide a safe and nurturing classroom environment where students can deepen their awareness of God's love and relationship with Him, as well as meet their potential for academic success.

Christian Education: Students will continue to study *Faerie Gold*, discussing virtues, life lessons, and biblical application to our lives. They will also explore the Exodus and the Israelites' journey and time in the wilderness. This month, students will:

- Learn about the ten commandments and God's covenant with Israel
- Study the stories *The Conceited Apple-Branch* and *The Nightingale*, both by Hans Christian Andersen, and *The Castle* by George MacDonald, discovering the qualities of a good friend
- Students will continue to learn about God's provision for the Israelites in the wilderness

Literature: Students will complete an enrichment project related to their studies of the King Arthur mythos and begin a second unit of poetry focused on sensory language. Literature class is conducted through the following activities:

- Read aloud, partner reading, choral reading
- Vocabulary, comprehension, and inference work
- Narration, discussion, and application

Writing: Students will expand their writing ability by imitating masterful compositions through the IEW program. This month, students will learn about creative writing through:

- Generating a list of possible writing ideas
- Identifying topics within writing ideas
- Writing in 5-paragraph essay format
- Writing from notes taken
- Adding dress-ups to make compositions more interesting
- Practicing writing conventions for multi-paragraph compositions

Spelling: Each month, students will practice memorizing phonograms and spelling rules as well as learn fifteen new words each week. Students will:

- Develop greater awareness of how the English language is structured
- Apply their skills to writing across the curriculum
- Learn and practice spelling rules

Grammar: Students will learn the rules of English grammar and apply them in their writing. This month, students will practice identifying and using:

- Adjectives
- Adverbs

Latin: This month in Latin, students will practice new vocabulary through gestures and classroom activities. Vocabulary words will center around the following topics:

- Reviewing previous chapters
- Time-related words
- Colours

French: In French class, students will learn about writing simple sentences using vocabulary words. Specifically, students will:

- Write sentences in French

Grade 3 – The Grammar Stage

Innova Academy's grammar school curriculum builds a solid academic foundation, emphasizing mastery of facts and fundamental skills. Grammar stage students have the natural ability to retain large amounts of information, so Innova intentionally builds knowledge across the curriculum immersing students in a holistic, unified, and rich learning experience. Students are actively engaged in learning while applying skills they have previously acquired to new, expansive content. Classrooms are filled with singing, chanting, movement, and engaging hands-on activities. Strong habits of heart, mind, and soul are reinforced, as students become more aware of their impact on others and build skills in self-governance and responsibility.

- Create a class writing composition using familiar vocabulary
- Create independent writing compositions to read to classmates

History: As students study world history chronologically, they learn about God's unfolding plan of redemption. This year, grade 3 students are studying the history, geography, and culture of the ancient civilizations of Greece, Rome, India, the Americas, and Far Eastern Empires. In May, students will learn about the first Roman prince, Augustus Caesar, and the beginning of Christianity. Topics include:

- Augustus Caesar
- The birth of Jesus
- The crucifixion and resurrection

Mathematics: In May, grade 3 students will delve into fractions. They will examine wholes that are divided into more than four equal parts and learn about equivalent fractions. Studies involve:

- Understanding fractions
- Understanding equivalent fractions
- Adding and subtracting like fractions

Science: Science is observing and describing God's creation. God's attributes, power, and divine nature can be clearly seen in what has been made (Romans 1:20). This year, students have the joy of studying biology. Students engage in hands on activities and experiments as they discover the wonders of God's creation. This month, students will complete their study of vertebrate animals. Students will practice being scientists and identify animals based on their characteristics. Areas of study include:

- Mammals
- Reptiles
- Amphibians

Visual Arts: In art, students will continue to explore the elements of design and develop their artistic skills drawing flowers and nature. Students will:

- Create a miniature flower arrangement
- Learn scratch art techniques
- Draw from nature

Music: This month, the grade 3 class will continue to build knowledge of theory and singing. They will also begin preparing for the spring concert. Activities will include:

- Folk dance
- Solfège reading, singing, and writing
- Identifying notes on a treble staff
- Intervals
- Vocal technique

Physical Education: During physical education classes, students develop agility, flexibility, endurance, and gross motor skills as well as practice good sportsmanship. While online, students will reinforce as many of these skills as possible within the limitations. A greater focus on general physical health will replace skills that cannot be worked on from home. Activities this month include:

- A workout series designed to build strength and improve coordination

Please note that although students in different grades often study the same topic, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.
