The Month Ahead At Innova

Grade 2 students are actively engaged in building foundational knowledge and skills in all subject areas. Our classroom is filled with singing, chanting, movement, and engaging hands-on activities. We seek to provide a safe and nurturing classroom environment where students can deepen their awareness of God's love and relationship with Him, as well as meet their potential for academic success.

Bible: This month, the grade 2 students will continue exploring how, according to Matthew 13:34, "Jesus spoke all these things to the crowd in parables." The parables offered the people stories to ponder - stories about familiar objects and ordinary experiences. Parables include:

- The Unmerciful Servant
- The Tenants
- The Marriage Feast
- The Pharisee and the Tax Collector
- The Loving Father

History: This year, the grade 2 class will explore Canada by studying the political and physical maps, symbols of Canada, Government, Freedoms, Outstanding Canadians, and Early Explorers. This month, students will:

- Finish studying Jacques Cartier
- Learn about John Cabot
- Complete an "If I were an explorer, I would...." project

Writing, Grammar, and Phonics: This year, grade 2 students will explore various classic poems and literature selections as models to develop their writing, grammar, vocabulary, and phonics skills. For the month of June, students will focus on the following:

- Literature and poem selections include: "How Creatures Move", "The Crab and His Teacher", "Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening", "The Farmer and the King", "Sea Fever", and "The Shepherd and the Sea"
- Grammar topics include review of -ly adverbs, strong verbs, because clause, quality adjectives, who-which clauses, and how to check and revise a paragraph using a check list
- Writing exercises focus on the topic/clincher rule, marking interesting details in a source text (up 6 points), asking questions to create interesting details, creating an outline independently, retelling a paragraph from the outline, writing a rough draft and final copy

Literature and Reading Fluency: Students will continue to build and refine their oral reading fluency as they explore the novel Sarah Plain and Tall by Patricia MacLachlan. Topics include:

- Identifying the main and supporting characters
- Making predictions
- Defining, memorizing, and using new vocabulary from the story
- Story sequencing
- Comprehension skills

Spelling: This month, students will use a variety of word and clapping games as they learn to apply spelling rules to list words. Spelling will focus on:

- Word analysis
- Writing original sentences
- A, E, O, U rules
- I and Y rule
- Silent final e rules
- ti, ci, si spellings of /sh/

Grade 2 – The Grammar Stage

Innova Academy's grammar school curriculum builds a solid academic foundation, emphasizing mastery of facts and fundamental skills. Students are actively engaged in learning while applying skills they have previously acquired to new, expansive content. Latin: Students will strengthen their vocabulary skills through the study of Latin. This month, the grade 2 students will focus on:

- Water words
- Gardening words
- Playing outdoor words

Mathematics: Grade 2 students begin each mathematics period practicing math facts with the CalcuLadder math drill program. Student progress through this program on an individual basis. In June, students will explore money and fractions as well as practice the following skills:

- 4 times tables
- Picture graphs
- Shapes and patterns

Science: Science is observing and describing God's creation. God's attributes, power, and divine nature can be clearly seen in what has been made (Romans 1:20). This year, students will have the joy of studying physics. Students engage in hands on activities and experiments as they discover the wonders of God's creation. In June, students will continue their study of physics learning about:

- Sound
- Galileo, Aristotle, and Copernicus
- Galileo and Space
- Constellations

Visual Arts: In June, students will continue to explore three-dimensional forms. They will apply their knowledge of elements and principles of design learned throughout the year to communicate meaning in their art. Students will:

- Learn about forms around the world, such as different iconic structures
- Create three-dimensional forms using salt clay and paper
- · Present meaning using their knowledge of elements and principles of design

Music: In music class, students will engage in activities involving all the areas of music learned throughout the year. Topics include:

- Solfege singing
- Rhythm syllables and notation
- Critical listening
- Composer study
- Treble clef notes

Physical Education: During the stay-at-home order, students are encouraged to spend time outside and enjoy God's creation through exercise. This month, students are encouraged to:

- Engage in outdoor activities to enjoy fresh air and to develop healthy habits
- · Go to the park and practice swinging, sliding, climbing, and playing kindly with others

Please note that although students in different grades often study the same topic, curricular expectations are tailored to individual grade levels.
